



"100% Life": Fact Sheet for the 25th Anniversary:

[CO "100% Life"](#) is the largest patient organization in Ukraine. Founded in 2001 by a group of 7 activists, the organization has grown into an international fund that implements complex projects. It operates in 24 regions of Ukraine and implements programs in public health, humanitarian aid, advocacy, digital solutions, and human rights protection.

Key figures:

25 years	a path from 7 activists to the largest patient organization in Ukraine
About UAH 12 billion	raised and distributed: donor, charitable and humanitarian assistance
UAH 3.5 billion	invested in the procurement of medical devices, medicines and equipment over the past 15 years
2.5 million people	received humanitarian support during the full-scale war
Almost UAH 3 billion	of humanitarian and charitable assistance transferred during the full-scale war
53 million doses of ARV drugs	urgently delivered to provide treatment to people living with HIV in the first months of the full-scale invasion
130,000 people	people living with HIV, among those for whom continuity of therapy during the war is ensured
Over 1,000,000 tests	the number of people who have been tested for HIV in the organization's projects
1,000 civil society organizations	NGOs that have received support over the past 15 years
6,800 deliveries	of medical goods and services carried out throughout Ukraine over the past 15 years
24 regions	is the regional presence of the organization in Ukraine

Timeline 2001–2026:

2001	A group of seven activists established the All-Ukrainian Network of People Living with HIV/AIDS.
2004	The activists prevented the interruption of treatment for all 137 HIV patients receiving medication at that time.
2010	Advocacy efforts by the organization and its partners helped reduce the cost of antiretroviral treatment 27-fold.
2014	During the Revolution of Dignity, the organization operated a field hospital in its office.

2016	Together with partners from the Ministry of Health and TI, the organization began implementing the eHealth system and opened the first healthcare center.
2017	The organization reduced the price of hepatitis C treatment by 81%.
2020	During the COVID-19 pandemic, the team began the construction of oxygen stations and delivered ARV therapy by mail.
2022	After the full-scale invasion began, the organization provided emergency delivery of antiretroviral therapy and humanitarian aid.
2024	More than 1 million Ukrainians have been tested for HIV as part of the organization's projects. Through the monitoring of the ITC system, "DATACHECK UKRAINE", developed by the organization, the delivery of 7 million services have been verified over 7 years
2026	CO "100% Life" celebrates the 25th anniversary of its activity.

What the “new standard of health care” means:

- Patient-centered approaches to all new decisions, projects, policies, and initiatives.
- Access to treatment without stigma, discrimination, or unnecessary bureaucracy.
- Priority to ensure continuity of treatment in the face of challenges.
- Digital services that clarify the patient's path;
- A network of healthcare centers that combine an evidence-based approach with a humane attitude.
